Youth Mental Health Campaign


Every parent wants their child to have a happy, healthy youth. Sadly, however, it's estimated that one in five Canadian youth are growing up with the heavy burden of a mental disorder, like anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia and psychosis.

Even more tragically, for some youth, the anguish and hopelessness are so great they turn to suicide. It's a desperate situation, made all the worse by the fact that there are no dedicated in-patient beds for youth in our region. Up until now, youth struggling with mental disorders have been admitted either to the medical pediatrics ward at Lions Gate, or into adult psychiatric in-patient facilities, neither

of which is suitable.

Now, with your help, there is new hope for our young people facing mental health and addiction crises. Lions Gate Hospital Foundation is partnering with VCH - Coastal Community of Care and the Provincial Government to open BC's first-ever Youth Concurrent Disorders Unit in the HOpe Centre at LGH.

The new Youth Concurrent Disorders Unit, scheduled to open in April 2017, will

provide youth with the "gold standard" in mental health treatment, supported by a multi-disciplinary team (psychiatrists, occupational therapists, teachers, counselors, etc.) who will work with each patient from initial diagnosis and treatment right through to discharge and connection to community resources. The goal is to provide these youth with the right diagnosis, treatment and continuity of community-based care to shift their trajectory into a positive, healthy adulthood.

In addition, the unit will provide state-ofthe-art addiction treatment for youth whose situation is complicated by co-morbid misuse of alcohol or drugs. Once operational, it's anticipated the Youth **Concurrent Disorders** Unit will provide mental health and co-morbid

addictions care to close

to 170 youths annually.

The new unit will occupy onehalf of the third floor of the HOpe Centre, providing care to youth ages 13 to 18 years from throughout the region, including the North Shore, Vancouver, Richmond, the Sea-to-Sky Corridor and Sunshine Coast.

In addition to receiving help with mental health and addictions issues, youth can continue to go to school, or receive vocational counseling, if they are thinking about working. Help is provided by an occupational therapist, physical therapist and social workers, among others.

New Dual Imaging Unit



Lions Gate Hospital Foundation, in partnership with Vancouver Coastal Health, is looking to bring a new dual fluoroscopy and x-ray unit to Lions Gate Hospital. It's all part of a bold new vision to better meet increasing need for imaging services, while also bringing better efficiencies to the Diagnostic Imaging Department.

The 18-year-old fluoroscopy unit is currently used only four hours a day, four days a week (fluoroscopy captures moving body structures pro-

ducing an image akin to an x-ray movie). The vision is to redevelop this under-utilized area into a dual unit, comprising a fluoroscopy unit and a state-of-the-art digital x-ray unit. This will allow the imaging department to do more chest x-rays from ER, and more bone x-rays from the cast clinic to relieve the backlog in both areas.

The new x-ray unit would use digital radiography, which is easier for technicians to use and produces highly detailed images almost instantaneously.

The new fluoroscopy unit will continue to provide moving x-rays for imaging swallowing studies, spinal procedures, joint injections and joint stress analysis.

Together, the new dual unit will increase efficiencies in patient flow and reduce wait times in the ER, cast clinic and for outpatients.
